Unit 1: Discovery and Colonization (1490-1763)

- Part 1 THE AGE OF DISCOVERY (17 minutes, 19 seconds). Covers Columbus' 1492 discovery of the New World and early Spanish, English and French explorations throughout the mid-sixteenth century. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-1-Part-1-Age-of-Discovery-17min.mp4)
- Part 2 ENGLISH EXPANSION (5 minutes, 47 seconds). Covers 16th century events, including the background behind religious turmoil in Europe, the first (unsuccessful) Virginia colony, and England's war with Spain. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-1-Part-2-English-Expansion-6min.mp4)
- Part 3 JAMESTOWN (10 minutes, 39 seconds). Covers the first three decades of the 17th century. Includes England's difficult colonization of Jamestown, from the days of John Smith and Pocahontas to the establishment of the House of Burgesses. Samuel de Champlain's founding of Quebec (for France) and the martyrdom of Father Brebeuf are also included in this section. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-1-Part-3-Jamestown-11min.mp4)
- Part 4 FREEDOM OF FAITH (12 minutes, 31 seconds). Covers the origins of religious persecution in 17th century Europe, the Pilgrims' journey on the Mayflower (and subsequent encounters with the Samoset and Squanto, leading to the first Thanksgiving), and the establishment of colonies in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Connecticut. - Part 5 COLONIAL EXPANSION (9 minutes, 45 seconds). Covers England's founding of New Hampshire and Maryland, Holland's founding of New Amsterdam, the English Civil War, the English takeover of New Amsterdam (New York), and the establishment of Carolina, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-1-Part-5-Colonial-Expansion-10min.mp4)
- Part 6 THE COMMERCE COLONIES (9 minutes, 8 seconds). Covers the competition between English and French merchants in establishing of trade relations with the Indians, and explains the effects of British mercantilism on the Chesapeake Bay colonies during the latter half of the 17th century. This section also recounts indentured servitude, the "headright" system, the first Navigation Acts, battles with Dutch trading companies, and Bacon's Rebellion. - Part 7 THE DOMINION OF NEW ENGLAND (10 minutes, 6 seconds). Covers late-seventeenth century events in New England, including King Philip's War (the first significant war between colonists and Indians), England's Glorious Revolution (1688), Leisler's Rebellion in New York (an early attempt to overthrow a colonial government), and the Salem witch trials. - Part 8 BORDER SKIRMISHES, POPULATION GROWTH, AND SPIRITUAL RENEWAL (12 minutes, 31 seconds). Covers King William's War and Queen Anne's War (resulting in England's military dominance over Europe), the influx of non-English European immigration to the colonies, and the settlement of the Georgia colony by inmates from debtors' prisons in England. This segment concludes with an account of the Great Awakening, a widespread spiritual revival that united inhabitants of separate colonies into a single American nation. - Part 9 NATURAL LAW AND THE FRENCH AND INDIAN WAR (14 minutes, 18 seconds). Examines the intertwining of European "Age of Reason" ideas with Great Awakening values, culminating in a natural rights doctrine that included freedom of the press (Zenger trial). This segment includes a profile of Benjamin Franklin, as well as a concise account of the conflict between the English colonists and combined French and Indian fighters (depicting the emergence of George Washington as a military figure). Unit 2: Independence (1763-1787)

- Part 1 SEEDS OF DISCORD (20 minutes, 15 seconds). Covers the ascendance of George III to the British throne, the rising political turmoil over the debt for the French and Indian War, and the beginnings of Parliament's oppression of the American colonies. This segment also includes Pontiac's Rebellion (Indians against colonists), and the colonists' reactions to the Sugar Act, Currency Act, Stamp Act, Quartering Act, and Townshend Acts. - Part 2 THE INTOLERABLE ACTS (13 minutes, 25 seconds). Recounts the Boston Massacre (1770), the Gaspee incident (burning of a British customs ship in 1772), and the Boston Tea Party (the dumping of British tea in Boston Harbor as a protest to the Tea Act of 1773). The segment also covers Parliament's passage of the Coercive Acts to punish the Massachusetts colonists, prompting the formation of the First Continental Congress (1774) and the passage of the Suffolk Resolves (declaring grievances against Parliament). The segment concludes with Parliament's response, the New England Restraining Act. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-2-Part-2-Intolerable-Acts-13min.mp4)
- Part 3 "LIBERTY OR DEATH!" (18 minutes, 7 seconds). Covers the events surrounding America's break from England, including Patrick Henry's call to arms, the battle at Lexington (launching the American Revolution), the invasions of Fort Ticonderoga and Crown Point, the assembly of the Second Continental Congress, the establishment of the Continental Army under George Washington, the Battle of Bunker (Breed's) Hill, King George III's defiant response, and the drafting of the Declaration of Independence. - Part 4 THE CONTINENTAL ARMY (19 minutes, 2 seconds). Recounts George Washington's disheartening military setbacks in New York, his turnaround victories at Trenton and Princeton, and his renewed difficulties in Pennsylvania. The segment also describes America's victory at Saratoga, the bleak Valley Forge winter of 1777, Thomas Paine's call to duty, the French alliance with the United States, America's currency woes, and the rebuilding of General Washington's army. - Part 5 HARDSHIP, PERSEVERANCE, AND VICTORY (11 minutes, 20 seconds). Covers battles at sea (such as John Paul Jones' victory against British naval forces) and along the frontier (such as George Rogers Clark's triumph in South Carolina). Also included are Benedict Arnold's shift in loyalties, the guerrilla wars waged by Thomas Sumter and Francis Marion ("the Swamp Fox"), and America's gradual retaking of the South. The segment concludes with the Battle of Yorktown, in which the American's, aided by French allies, defeat the British and end the War for Independence. - Part 6 POSTWAR CHALLENGES (15 minutes, 57 seconds). Recounts the Treaty of Paris (securing the peace between Great Britain and the United States) in 1783, and examines the postwar difficulties arising in America, such as the war debt that crushed the economy, the military revolt that threatened the nation's fledgling government, the refusal of state governments to abide by the terms of the Treaty of Paris, the enactment of the Northwest Ordinance (Congress' claim of authority over lands that had not achieved statehood), the struggle with Spain over navigation rights to the Mississippi River, and Daniel Shays' armed rebellion against the Massachusetts court system. The program concludes with the call for a stronger federal government than the one created under the Articles of Confederation. Unit 3: The New Nation and Its Constitution (1787-1824)

- Part 1 THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION (14 minutes, 41 seconds). Reviews the problems that called for a more effective government, and covers primary events that took place within the Constitutional Convention of 1787, with insights into the role of federal government under the Constitution. - Part 2 RATIFICATION (10 minutes, 12 seconds). Recounts the difficulties in getting states to approve the Constitution, leading to the authoring of the Federalist Papers and the drafting of the Bill of Rights. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-3-Part-2-Ratification-10min.mp4)
- Part 3 THE WASHINGTON ADMINISTRATION (17 minutes, 56 seconds). Examines George Washington's development of the executive branch of government and Alexander Hamilton's solution to the nationwide financial crisis, amidst Thomas Jefferson's efforts to limit the powers of federal government. Also included is the impact of the French Revolution on American foreign policy (culminating in Jay's Treaty with Great Britain and Pinckney's Treaty with Spain). The segment concludes with the federal government's handling of domestic fights, such as the Whiskey Rebellion and the Battle of Fallen Timbers. - Part 4 RATIONALISM AND REVIVAL (14 minutes, 14 seconds). Recounts the presidency of John Adams, including the XYZ Affair, the quasi-war with France, the Alien and Sedition Acts, the transfer of the nation's capital from Philadelphia to Washington City, the stormy election of 1800, and Adams' "midnight appointments" to the federal judiciary. This is followed by the election of Thomas Jefferson, occurring at a time of philosophical change and spiritual revival (via the Second Great Awakening). - Part 5 THE JEFFERSON YEARS (17 minutes, 41 seconds). Encompasses such events as the Marbury v. Madison case, the Barbary War, the Louisiana Purchase, the Hamilton-Burr duel, the Aaron Burr trial, the Lewis and Clark expeditions, and the journeys of Zebulon Pike. Also presented in this segment are the Yazoo land controversy, France's war with Great Britain, the Chesapeake-Leopard Affair, British "impressment" of American seamen, and the beginning of the anti-slavery movement. - Part 6 JAMES MADISON AND THE WAR OF 1812 (18 minutes, 47 seconds). Covers the diplomatic betrayal by France's Napoleon Bonaparte, the Indian revolt in the Louisiana Territory, the Battle of Tippecanoe, the escalation of British troops at the Canadian border, and America's declaration of war against Great Britain. A chronology of the War of 1812 follows, including the Constitution-Guerriere sea battle, the defeat of the USS Chesapeake, British occupation of Detroit and Fort Dearborn (Chicago), and the Battle of Lake Erie, the British capture of Fort Niagara, the Battles of Plattsburg and Horseshoe Bend, Andrew Jackson's capture of Pensacola, the British invasion of Washington, DC (with the burning of the White House and Capitol), the American defense of Fort McHenry (where Francis Scott Key penned "The Star-Spangled Banner"), and the Treaty of Ghent. - Part 7 THE MORAL VICTORY (14 minutes, 18 seconds). Provides an account of Andrew Jackson's overwhelming victory over British forces at the Battle of New Orleans, as well as the defeat of Barbary Pirates; followed by the postwar "Era of Good Feelings" in America, facilitated by the growth of textile industries, the development of steamboat travel, the demilitarization of the US-Canadian border, the Transcontinental Treaty (in which Spain ceded Florida to the US), the issuance of the Monroe Doctrine against further European interference in the Americas, and the rapid addition of new states to the union. Unit 4: Westward Expansion and the Roots of Sectionalism (1824-1850)

- Part 1 DAYS OF PROSPERITY AND RESTLESSNESS (20 minutes, 11 seconds). Explores the origins of slavery in the southern regions of the United States, plus Christianity's role in launching the abolition movement. The segment also covers the beginnings of industrialization in the northern cities, the westward migration of farm families, the expansion of trade in the west, the development of interstate roads, the construction of the Erie canal, and the birth of American literature; concluding with the hotly contested presidential election of 1824. - Part 2 JOHN QUINCY ADAMS AND "KING ANDREW" (16 minutes, 15 seconds). Examines social reform amidst ideological divisiveness, encompassing events during the presidency of John Quincy Adams, such as Indian and states' rights controversies. The segment proceeds with the election of Andrew Jackson and his employment of a "spoils" system in making federal appointments. The Webster-Hayne Debate is also reviewed here. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-4-Part-2-John-Quincy-Adams-and-King-Andrew-16min.mp4)
- Part 3 UPHEAVAL (15 minutes, 21 seconds). Covers Jedediah Smith's western travels, as well as the government persecution of Cherokee Indians, culminating in the "Trail of Tears," the forced expulsion of Cherokees from Georgia to Oklahoma. The segment also examines the changing religious landscape of the nation, and concludes with the chilling effect of the Nat Turner revolt on the slavery debate. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-4-Part-3-Upheaval-15min.mp4)
- Part 4 JACKSONIAN DEMOCRACY (14 minutes, 12 seconds). Covers Andrew Jackson's abandonment of the centralized banking system and his stand against South Carolina's 1832 threat to secede from the union. This is followed by Henry Clay's tariff compromise, the assassination attempt on Jackson, and the publication of "Democracy in America." The segment concludes with the war between Mexico and Texas. (This is a chronology that begins with Mexico's sale of Texas land to the Austin family; its later attempt to drive American settlers out of the region; the ensuing Battle of the Alamo in 1836; further American defeats; Sam Houston's turnaround victory at the Battle of San Jacinto; and the founding of the Republic of Texas as an independent nation.) - Part 5 "MANIFEST DESTINY!" (17 minutes, 36 seconds). Segment begins with the financial panic faced by President Martin Van Buren after his predecessor, Andrew Jackson, issued the economically devastating Specie Circular before leaving office. Also included is the killing of abolitionist Elijah P. Lovejoy, the proposal for gradual emancipation, and the brief presidency--and untimely death--of William Henry Harrison, followed by John Tyler's ascendance to the presidency. The segment concludes with Tyler's rejection Whig Party policies, renewed hostilities between the Brits and Americans at the Canadian border, the 1844 election of James K. Polk, and the annexation of Texas as a state (prompting a declaration of war from Mexico). (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-4-Part-5-Manifest-Destiny-18min.mp4)
- Part 6 THE WAR WITH MEXICO (10 minutes, 48 seconds). Provides a chronology of the war, from the Battle of Palo Alto to the invasion of Mexico City, plus the subsequent Guadalupe-Hildago Treaty, and the development of the Popular Sovereignty approach to slavery in the newly acquired territories. The segment also includes the California gold rush. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-4-Part-6-The-War-with-Mexico-11min.mp4)
- Part 7 ELUSIVE HARMONY (12 minutes, 13 seconds). Examines milestones in progress and inventiveness (including McCormick's reaper, Howe's sewing machine, Mann's education reform, Morse' telegraph system, advancements in mental health care, plus overall city street improvements, rail construction, etc.) in contrast to religious and political rifts over slavery. Also covers the Zachary Taylor presidency, California statehood, and the Missouri Compromise of 1850. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-4-Part-7-Elusive-Harmony-12min.mp4)

Unit 5: Secession, Civil War, and Reconstruction (1850-1877)

- Part 1 MISGUIDED NOTIONS AND POLITICAL DIVISION (12 minutes, 45 seconds). Covers the role of "Uncle Tom's Cabin" in shaping public opinion toward slavery, the 1852 election of Franklin Pierce, Commodore Perry's journey to Japan, and the Gadsden Purchase from Mexico. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-5-Part-1-Misguided-Notions-Political-Division-13min.mp4)
- Part 2 "BLEEDING" KANSAS (17 minutes, 35 seconds). Examines the consequences of the disastrous Kansas-Nebraska Act, the formation of the Republican Party, the disputed election and ensuing guerrilla warfare in Kansas, and violence in the Senate. The segment also encompasses the presidential election of James Buchanan in 1856, the Dred Scott case, the constitutional crisis in Kansas, and the bank panic of 1857. - Part 3 THE RISE OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN AND THE SECESSION OF THE SOUTH (13 minutes, 1 second). Covers the Lincoln-Douglas debates, John Brown's assault on Harper's Ferry, Abraham Lincoln's presidential victory in the election of 1860, the secession of the southern states, the formation of the Confederate States of America, the election of Jefferson Davis as the Confederate president, and Lincoln's stand against secession. - Part 4 THE WAR BEGINS (13 minutes, 14 seconds). Covers the Union loss at Fort Sumter, Lincoln's suspension of constitutional rights, the Battle of Bull Run (Manassas), the split of West Virginia from Virginia, the failed union naval blockade of southern ports, diplomatic issues with Great Britain, and the Union capture of Port Royal Sound. - Part 5 1862 (17 minutes, 17 seconds). Chronicles such 1862 events as: the Union victories at Forts Henry and Donelson, the Confederate victory at Shiloh, the battle between the iron-clad warships Virginia (nee Merrimac) and the Monitor, the Union dominance of Mississippi River, the Battle of Seven Pines, Congress' passage of the Homestead Act, the Confederate victory at Second Battle of Bull Run, the Union's turnaround victory at Antietam, Lincoln's issuance of the Emancipation Proclamation, the paradoxical participation of blacks and Cherokee Indians in the Confederate Army, the creation of the Underground Railroad, and the Union defeat at Fredericksburg. - Part 6 THE TURNING TIDE (12 minutes, 58 seconds). Covers Lincoln's implementation of a temporary income tax to finance the war, dissention in the Confederate government, anti-war protests in New York, the costly Confederate victory at Chancellorsville, the pivotal Battle of Gettysburg, the Union victories at Chickamauga and Lookout Mountain, the organization of field hospitals, the successful Union campaign at Vicksburg, and the Union occupation of Chattanooga. - Part 7 THE FALL OF THE SOUTH (18 minutes, 30 seconds). Recounts Lincoln's Gettysburg Address, General Sherman's march to Atlanta, the military standoffs at the Wilderness and Spotsylvania, the southern stand at Cold Harbor, the siege of Richmond, the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain, the fall of the Confederacy at Petersburg,, and General Lee's surrender at Appomattox. The segment also presents Lincoln's second inauguration, his assassination, Andrew Johnson's Amnesty Proclamation, the Congressional persecution of former Confederate states, the establishment of Freedmen's Bureaus for former slaves, Republican passage of the first Civil Rights Act (1866), America's military assistance to the Juarez regime in Mexico, the implementation of retaliatory reconstruction acts on southern states, and the impeachment--but not removal--of Andrew Johnson. Part 8 - RECONSTRUCTION AND CORRUPTION (12 minutes, 43 seconds). Covers the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad, Seward's purchase of Alaska, the election of Ulysses S. Grant, the arrival of "Carpetbaggers" in the former confederacy, the "Black Friday" economic crisis in 1869, the Tweed Ring scandal, the financial panic of 1873, the Whiskey Ring Fraud, the disputed presidential election of 1876, and the end of Reconstruction. Unit 6: The Empire Years (1877-1912)

- Part 1 TWILIGHT OF THE FRONTIER ERA (12 minutes, 32 seconds). Covers the aftermath of the Battle of Little Big Horn, the Nez Perce tribe's peace overtures, the rise of corporations, the inventions of Thomas Edison and Alexander Graham Bell, the beginning of professional baseball, the growing popularity of Mark Twain, the popularity of P.T. Barnum's traveling circus, the changes in lifestyles brought on by rail transportation, the railway strike of 1877, and the opening of relations with Mexico. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-6-Part-1-Twilight-of-the-Frontier-Era-13min.mp4)
- Part 2 THE NEW RELIGIONS (15 minutes, 11 seconds). Explores the promotion of non-traditional thought, including the English translation of the Communist Manifesto, as well as the emergence of Darwinism. The segment also covers the new influx of European immigrants, the rise of the Social Gospel movement, the Moody revivals, the founding of the Christian Science religion, the presidential election of 1880, and the assassination of President Garfield. (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-6-Part-2-The-New-Religions-15min.mp4)
- Part 3 PROGRESS AND PAIN (14 minutes, 45 seconds). Explores the age of invention, Booker T. Washington's founding of the Tuskegee Institute, Clara Barton's establishment of the Red Cross, the resurgence of art and literature, the popularity of "Wild West" shows, the difficult presidency of Chester Arthur, the election of Grover Cleveland (as well as his White House wedding), France's gift of the Statue of Liberty, the construction of early skyscraper buildings, the onset of labor riots, and the contributions of America's "Captains of Industry," (Video File: AmericanTestimony-Unit-6-Part-3-Progress-and-Pain-15min.mp4)
- Part 4 COURSE CORRECTIONS (17 minutes, 24 seconds). Examines the increase in leisure activities, the trend toward reparations to the Indians, the election of Benjamin Harrison, the expansion of trade with Latin America, the stance against German aggression in the Pacific, the Oklahoma Land Run, the passage of the Sherman Anti-Trust Act, the failed currency manipulation schemes of the government, and the modernization of the navy. Also included in this segment are the Wounded Knee skirmish, the deadly Homestead union strike, the return of Grover Cleveland to the White House, the onset of the economic depression of 1893, the Pullman Strike, and the Supreme Court's rejection of the income tax. - Part 5 "A SPLENDID LITTLE WAR" (18 minutes, 32 seconds). The segment begins with benign events, including the advent of motion pictures and the admission of Utah to the union; then turns to the the Cuban revolt against Spain, the election of William McKinley, the mysterious explosion of the USS Maine, and passage of the Teller Amendment. Thereafter, a chronological account of the Spanish-American War is presented, from Dewey's naval victory in the Philippines to the charge of the Rough Riders at San Juan Hill in Cuba. Also covered are the American annexations of Wake Island and Hawaii, Spain's surrender, the granting of independence to Cuba, and the U.S. acquisitions of Puerto Rico, Guam and the Philippines. - Part 6 THE TUMULTUOUS TURN OF THE CENTURY (22 minutes, 15 seconds). Recounts American charity in elevating living conditions in Cuba and the Philippines, the destruction of Galveston by hurricane, the assassination of President McKinley, the surrender of Filipino rebels, Theodore Roosevelt's interventions in business and labor crises, the construction on the Panama Canal, and the Wright Brothers' first airplane flight in 1903. The segment also includes Theodore Roosevelt's contribution to the settlement of the Russo-Japanese War, the deadly San Francisco earthquake, the admission of Oklahoma to statehood, and the Pacific tour of the "Great White Fleet" as a show of American naval superiority. Unit 7: Collectivism and the First World War (1912-1928)

- Part 1 MR. WILSON AND "COLONEL" HOUSE (21 minutes, 6 seconds). Covers the advent of automobile production, the sinking of the Titanic, the ideological development of Woodrow Wilson, the president's endorsement of the Marxist policies of personal aide Edward Mandell House, the implementation of such collectivist government edicts as the graduated income tax and the central banking monopoly, passage of stricter antitrust legislation, the federal takeover of interstate commerce, Wilson's racial segregation of the federal government, Marcus Garvey's "back to Africa" movement, the death of the first lady, and the president's quick remarriage. - Part 2 THE GROWING INTERNATIONAL CRISIS (22 minutes, 3 seconds). Encompasses President Wilson's interference in Mexican affairs, the opening of the Panama Canal, the assassinations of Austrian Archduke Franz Ferdinand and his wife, Austria's declaration of war on Serbia, Germany's declarations of war on Russia and France, the German invasion of Belgium, England's declaration of war on Germany, Wilson's proclamation of American neutrality, the German sinking of the British passenger ship Lusitania, Poncho Villa's raids on US border towns, Wilson's dispatch of troops to Mexico, the scandal of the Zimmermann telegram (in which Germany sought and alliance with Mexico to battle the US), the Bolshevik revolution in Russia, and the US declaration of war on Germany. - Part 3 UNRESTRAINED AUTHORITY (14 minutes, 13 seconds). Examines the roots of Bolshevism, then provides a chronology of these events: the Wilson administration's elevation of income tax rates, the implementation of the military draft, the government takeover (through the Lever Act) of food and fuel production, the arrival of American troops in France, the government takeover of domestic arms manufacturing, Lenin's rise to power in Russia, the Russian Communist peace treaty with Germany, the legislation to prohibit liquor, Woodrow Wilson's issuance of his Fourteen Points, legislation to grant women the right to vote, and the executive branch's takeover of federal agencies during wartime (through the Overman Act). - Part 4 THE "GREAT WAR" AND ITS AFTERMATH (24 minutes, 15 seconds). This segment provides a brief chronology of America's actions in World War I, including the invasions of Murmansk and Archangel in Russia, the numerous battles to drive the Germans out of France, the exploits of Alvin York and Eddie Rickenbacker, the collapse of the Central Powers countries, and the Armistice ending the war. Thereafter, pertinent details are presented on the ill-conceived Treaty of Versailles, the economic decimation of Germany, the haphazard redrawing of national boundaries in Central Europe, the massacre of the Russian royal family, the Bolshevik-inspired labor and race riots in the US, Woodrow Wilson's battle against Congress for US admission in the League of Nations, and the White House cover-up of the president's near-fatal stroke. The segment concludes with the Scopes Monkey Trial, Charles Lindbergh's solo flight across the Atlantic, the signing of the Kellogg-Briand Pact, and the fruits of "Coolidge Prosperity." Unit 8: The "New Deal" Autocracy and World War 2 (1928-1945)

- Part 1 HERBERT HOOVER'S CRISIS (13 minutes, 17seconds). Also covers the American Socialist movement, Japan's invasion of Manchuria, and the Bonus Expedition march on Washington. - Part 2 FDR (16 minutes, 25seconds). Describes the personal and political journey of Franklin D. Roosevelt to the White House, and recounts the early missteps of legislative acts conceived by his "Brain Trust" (such as the National Recovery Act, the Tennessee Valley Authority, etc.). - Part 3 PROLONGING THE DEPRESSION (17 minutes, 21 seconds). Examines the ways that programs designed to alleviate the depression actually worsened it, causing the immediate 40% drop in the value of the dollar. The segment also includes passage of the Tydings-McDuffie Act (granting future independence to the Philippines), the rise of Adolf Hitler in Germany, the abandonment of the first New Deal in favor of FDR's Second New Deal (a series of socialist policies to redistribute the nation's privately-earned assets), the Supreme Court's rejection of certain New Deal as unconstitutional, the passage of the Social Security Act, the Italian invasion of Ethiopia, FDR's declaration of neutrality toward European conflicts, and the accumulation of power by Germany's Adolf Hitler and Italy's Benito Mussolini. - Part 5 THE DAWN OF WORLD WAR 2 (17 minutes, 33 seconds). Covers the geopolitical division of Poland between Germany and the Soviet Union, the Soviet invasions of Finland and the Baltic nations, Germany's invasions of Norway and Denmark, FDR's dispatch of naval patrols around Greenland, the German drive to France (invading the Netherlands, Belgium and Luxembourg in the process), the humiliating defeat of British forces at Dunkirk, the surrender of France to the Germans, Japan's closure of Chinese ports, the enactment of America's first peacetime military draft, the German bombing raids on London, America's Lend-Lease policy toward Great Britain, Germany's attack on former ally Russia, the US naval escalation in Iceland, the Japanese invasion of southern Indochina, FDR's oil embargo against Japan, the Atlantic Charter meeting between Roosevelt and Winston Churchill, the German naval skirmishes with American warships in the Atlantic, and Japan's failed negotiations with the United States. - Part 6 AMERICA ENTERS THE WAR (15 minutes, 10 seconds). Part 7 - THE ROAD TO VICTORY (20 minutes, 50 seconds). The segment concludes with General MacArthur's triumphant return to the Philippines, the brutal battles at Iwo Jima and Okinawa, the massive German surprise assault at Bastogne (the Battle of the Bulge), the death of Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry Truman's ascension to the presidency, the Soviet invasion of Berlin, the execution of Mussolini, the suicide of Hitler, the German surrender, Truman's Potsdam Conference with Churchill and Stalin, the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, the Japanese surrender, and the discovery of the Nazi death camps. Unit 9: Cold War America (1945-1968)

- Part 3 CHINA, KOREA, AND THE LOSS OF AMERICAN RESOLVE (18 minutes, 58 seconds).
